



Future activities - MiningImpact

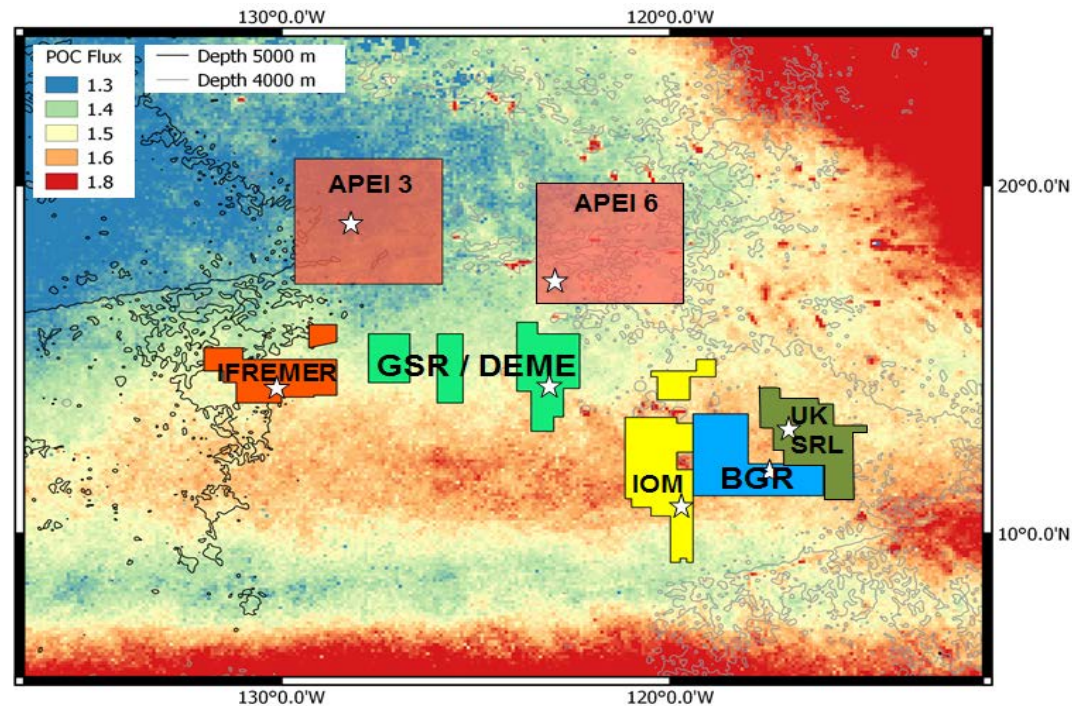
- Pilot Action MiningImpact Project coming to an end on 31st of December 2017
- 25 partners from 11 JPI member states participated in 36-month project
- Final Meeting was held in London on 18 Oct.
- Key Results and recommendations summarised in a factsheet.



1st phase was conducted successfully - however, several aspects need to be investigated further:

-
- - the fate and impact of mining generated particle plumes
- - the definition of appropriate indicators of ecosystem health and threshold values for “harmful effects”
- measures to mitigate significant adverse effects,
- an assessment of associated environmental risks
- implementation of scientific knowledge into improved legislation for ISA

As follow-up of the former Joint Action, on August 1, 2017, several JPI Oceans MS launched a joint call for proposals to further study environmental impacts and risks associated with seabed mining.



- It calls for cruise proposals on RV SONNE in early 2019 to be conducted in the Clariton-Clipperton Zone

- Submission deadline is set to November 1, 2017
- To support the formation of consortia a virtual brokerage space has been set-up

This call is being conducted as a follow-up of the Joint Action under the framework of JPI Oceans. It calls for cruise proposals for the RV SONNE in early 2019 in the Clarion-Clipperton Fracture Zone (CCZ), subequatorial eastern Pacific.
